6. Matters arising from the correspondence

In early June, the ACC wrote to various ministers and the WA Premier's office regarding the status of school sport and the current imbalances with regards to community sport COVID-19 Phase 3 guidelines. A formal response was received from Sue Ellery which outlined the changes that would be implemented once phase 3 was introduced.

Everything is looking positive for phase 4 which commences on the 27th June. The ACC Sport Coordinators will be updated with any changes relevant to school sport once this information is released from the government departments.

7. Treasurer's report

The Term 2 invoices have not yet been emailed out. The ACC usually invoice schools once per term and this invoice will go out either next week or early in Term 3. The invoice will be for any Term 1 or Term 2 costs such as nomination of teams linked into the basketball championship pools or one day carnivals held back in March, shared sub association costs from Term 1 for central venue hire, umpires, and officials. Another invoice will also come out at the end of Term 3 for carnivals and costs during the Term 3 period including athletics.

ACC Council approved the detailed ACC financial report/position at the recent Council meeting held last week. Council supported the position that any cost saving during 2020 will be rolled over to a reduction in fees or user shared costs in 2021 where applicable given any surplus.

ACC Staffing

DoS gave special thankyou and acknowledgement to ACC Inclusion and Sports Administration Officer Gina Grayson-Cassey and the wonderful work she has done with the ACC over the past 10 years. The work that the ACC do in the inclusion space is the best practice in the industry and the association is a leader in the school system in Australia. Gina's dedication and ability to network and bring people together has contributed to making this happen. Well done Gina and the ACC is very appreciative of all the work she has achieved.

The ACC is now advertising a new fulltime position with the ACC as the Inclusion and Participation Manager. The ACC had previously set aside funding for a sports administration assistant during 2020 which did not occur. The money will now be set aside to employ and expand the position previously held by Gina into a new full-time position with the ACC.

The Inclusion and Participation Manager is a fantastic career opportunity to work with the ACC. The general focus of the role will still be on Inclusion and No Limits disability sport, but it will also expand into the participation space for all students. There will be an emphasis on activities and events that are not highly competitive, but more about fun, enjoyment and social interaction. This inclusion expansion will incorporate indigenous, multicultural and women in sport opportunities. Inclusion and diversity are key aspects of the ACC mission and are important future directions for the association.

DOS encouraged Sport Coordinators and schools to promote the job opportunity within the school and PE departments. The job application has been open since Monday and will **close Wednesday 1 July**. Short listing and interviews will take place fairly rapidly with a view to starting the new role at the beginning of Term 3.

ACC Sport COVID19 - Phase 3 guidelines moving into Phase 4

Recently the WA Premier announced the restrictions for Phase 4 that will be starting Saturday 27 June. The government also advised that the 18 July is a provisional date set for when we may move into Phase 5.

DOS outlines that this will hopefully be very positive for ACC sport and will hopefully remove any barriers for sport such as space restrictions and set numbers of people. Preventative measures such as personal hygiene, cleaning and social distancing will be things that likely need to be continued for the foreseeable future.

At this stage the ACC do not know precisely what restrictions Phase 4 will involve that are specific for school sport. It is worth noting that during the initial start of Phase 3 we had some imbalance between what restrictions were in place for community sport and what was permitted for school sport which was eventually changed. The ACC will be currently continuing with Phase 3 protocols until clarification on Phase 4 which should be updated very soon by the government departments.

Once the ACC receive relevant information from the government departments specific to Phase 4 the ACC will update any ACC Covid19 documents such as:

- o COVID19 Safety Guidelines
- o Return to ACC Sport 10 Point Checklist
- COVID19 Safety Plan and Certificate

Athletics Carnivals – contingency update

The Athletics is looking very positive with the restrictions further lifting for Phase 4 and potentially also at Phase 5 by the time the athletic carnivals arrive in September. Schools and Sport Coordinators should plan ahead for the full normal athletics program at this stage.

Gina Grayson-Cassey (ACC) outlines that Athletics WA have just set the dates for the upcoming School meets:

- WA State Cross Country Championships 16 August
- WA Nitro Schools Challenge Tuesday 25 August (this is the week prior to ACC athletics carnivals starting)
- WA All Schools Championships 30 October 1 November
- Australian All Schools Championships 4-6 December

DOS mentions that a number of ACC schools enter the Nitro Schools Challenge each year prior to the ACC carnivals beginning and they are a great initiative and really fun event for the schools preparing for athletics. Last year the national Nitro event was streamed live and it was great to watch some of the ACC athletes competing.

Cross Country Carnival – school based events

This initiative is now operating and has already had at least 12 schools running school based Cross Country events. Another group of schools are also now booked in with the two Cross Country providers Blue Chip Timing and Timing Solutions with this number set to increase throughout the remainder of term 2 and into Term 3.

Virtual Cross Country Results will be open until 31 August.

The data is linking well between the two Cross Country providers. Some Sub Association groups are looking to run joint interschool events such as NAS and NWAS that will help split the total cost amongst the schools. DOS mentions that if small clusters of schools will be combining to run a cross country carnival that they must advise the ACC office once this has been finalised so that the ACC office can provide any guidance or assistance.

DOS mentions that it is great to see some member schools taking up these school based Cross Country alternative options in 2020 due to the cancelled ACC cross country. The schools are providing some much needed physical activity for students and business for the two WA timing providers who will have undergone some hardship due to the COVID situation. DOS also mentions that some schools may have some parents that are unhappy that their son or daughter has not had an opportunity to run, especially if they are talented runners that would have liked to push for All Stars selection in the virtual carnival.

History Project - update

DOS – updated SMC with the progress. Chapters 1-3 of the book have been completed and a new brief history section has also been completed and updated on the ACC website. The project is on track for the book launch in November 2021.

Hall of Fame Proposal

The Hall of Fame Proposal will eventually also be on the ACC website and acknowledges post-secondary sporting achievements of past students from schools affiliated with the ACC. This will bring great attention to the ACC's history and heritage.

The ACC will need to form a small subcommittee to be able to focus attention and guide the decisions to be made around the structure of the Hall of Fame. It will be a great PR initiative for the ACC and member schools. The subcommittee should include members from the Executive, SMC and Council. The DOS and Principal of Mazenod College, Andrew Watson, will be leading the small subcommittee and we are looking for SMC volunteers to assist. The commitment on the subcommittee would not be onerous and only requires a small number of meetings to help plan out the Hall of Fame process. GoJaro - Competition Management Implementation & Review

The ACC conducted a survey late Term 1 asking for specific feedback on the back end, interface and mobile app. Results were collated and the feedback was provided to the GoJaro administration. The ACC is currently working with GoJaro to implement the improvements ready for the second half of the year. The ACC is still waiting to see if the product is exactly what we are looking for before committing to 2021.

Virtual Swimming All Stars Team Selection

Due to the cancellation of the ACC swimming carnivals this year, the ACC conducted a virtual Swimming All Stars team selection. Schools were asked to submit times for students who would potentially qualify for the team this year. It also provided an opportunity for students who may have been in their final year to qualify for ACC Letters in swimming.

There were strict guidelines as to how the times were to be recorded. The ACC realise the process would not be perfect, however with times taken from an electronic timing system, 50m swimming performance and no stop watch times allowed, results would be as accurate as possible.

The ACC checked and collated all results, and selected the team which was announced this week. Certificates and all star pins will be sent out next week. Letters award recipients will also be announced next week.

All Stars Basketball & Netball - update

Nethall

Player nominations have now been received and initial trials are currently being held at Corpus Christi College. The first trial was 21 June with a second this Sunday 28 June. Thank you to Corpus Christi for allowing the ACC to use their venue again this year. A final trial match will then be held in term 3 on Thursday 6 August. This game will possibly be held at Emmanuel CC but is TBC.

Player nomination numbers were strong this year with well over 50 players including state representatives and previous All Stars players. The Netball All Stars was a proposed tri series in 2020 with IGGSA and SSWA. IGGSA have currently committed to the playing date and the ACC is still waiting on confirmation from SSWA.

Thank you to the 2020 coaching staff in Claire de Reus (Coach), Zoey Baxter (Assistant Coach) both from Emmanuel CC and to Jess Rees from Mater Dei (Team Manager). Thanks also to Deb Santaromita for assisting and managing the venue at Corpus Christi for the two initial trial dates, and to Sherrie Errington (Guildford Grammar) and Kate Izard (St Norbert) for their assistance also.

Basketball

ACC Basketball staff positions for 2020 were announced in early June.

Boys Team: Coach Mark Shipley (John Septimus Roe ACS), Assistant Coach Caolan Dodgson (Lumen Christi College) and Team Manager Mike Burgermeister (Chisholm College).

Girls Team: Coach Ryan Godfrey (St Norbert College), Assistant Coach Luke Ford (St Andrew's Grammar) and Team Manager Colin Driscoll (St Norbert College).

The ACC was recently advised that SSWA would not participate in the All Stars Basketball in 2020. This was due to COVID restrictions and the cancellation of SSWA basketball season competitions running during Term 2. IGGSA have committed to playing in the All Stars Girls Basketball. The ACC is waiting to hear back from a proposal made to the PSA for an All Stars Boys Basketball game in the absence of SSWA in 2020.

Player nominations have been held back until further details of playing dates.

Carnival Management Software – Meet Manger Review

The ACC office has been conducting some ongoing research into different carnival software packages. SportsTrak is an outdated software and unfortunately whilst a very good product it will not be updated in the future, which is driving the ACC to research new software. SportsTrak was great in that it was purpose built for school carnivals. The negative to SportsTrak is that it does not integrate at all with the newer timing systems used at HBF Stadium (swimming) or Athletics Stadium.

Meet Manager is the biggest carnival software system around the world and gets used at both school and international level. The main problem is that it is a very complicated system with multiple software platforms and is not as user friendly for schools as programs like SportsTrak are. It is American based and is difficult getting any kind of regular online support.

Meet Manager would have certain benefits such as the integrated timing i.e. less officials required in results room to enter results manually. However, it would increase more pressure on schools and Sport Coordinators with meet manager essentially requiring students to be entered in each event pre carnival, not just an on the carnival day using student numbers. This could be a significant challenge for lower division schools that have multiple changes and place students in events more based on carnival day.

The ACC will further research Meet Manager and other software and provide updates to the Executive and SMC.

ACC AFL Carnivals – update

Year 7 Carnivals

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, the ACC held all year 7 AFL carnivals on the one date this year, with the rescheduling of the North Metro carnival. All carnivals were held on Tuesday 23 June at various regional venues. The ACC was happy with how the carnivals ran, and it was great seeing such enthusiastic year 7's soaking up the sun and playing sport with their school friends.

Each carnival produced a winner to play in next week's grand final carnivals which will be held at Hamer Park (Boys) and Inglewood Oval (Girls). Carnival details have been emailed to the following winning schools.

ACC Championship - contingency update

<u>Basketball:</u> ACC Championship elimination bracket was successfully moved into Term 3. The bracket will be released at the end of week 4 following any final sub association catch up/deciding games. These knockouts begin during week 5 and will then be completed with the Grand Finals at Warwick Stadium (Juniors – 1 September and Seniors – 8 September). The ACC is looking into streaming the Grand Finals with 4style media which would be a great boost for the competition status.

Basketball Grand Final Streaming – the ACC has been working closely with 4Style Media especially in the swimming and athletics carnivals. 4Style Media have provided the ACC with some price quotes based around variable packages for the streaming services of the ACC Basketball Championship Grand Finals. The packages mainly revolve around the total quantity of cameras and staffing required for the service. This streaming cost would be divided amongst the teams competing in the Championship Grand Finals at Warwick Stadium in 2020. When the bracket is released at the end of week 4 (Term 3) a quick survey will also be conducted by the ACC for teams involved in the elimination bracket to decide whether this is something that the schools would like to include for 2020.

Package 1: approx. value at \$750.00 to be split amongst the 4 x Grand Final Teams (Girls & Boys) Package 2: approx. value \$1200.00 to be split amongst the 4 x Grand Final Teams (Girls & Boys)

Nic Italiano (Chisholm): will schools have the flexibility with ACC Basketball Championship game dates as some fixtures may clash with revised T3 sport.

Trent Sharpe (ACC): similar to 2019, the Round of 16 and Quarter Finals will have some flexibility provided the game is mutually rescheduled by both teams and it is played within that weeks - timeframe. Semi Finals & Grand Finals dates are set as these have referee and venue bookings attached.

Netball: ACC Championship Netball will be run as a One Day Carnival format in 2020. This will be held on the 19 August at the Gold Netball Centre and Perth Netball Association. This is open to all member schools and will be a very enjoyable day of high quality netball with schools entering their strongest possible senior team. **Netball nominations are open until Wednesday 1 July (Wk 10, Term 2).**

David Colin-Thome (Kingsway): question about the potential for squad sizes to increase for the ACC Championship One Day Carnivals due to the number of games in the day (highly competitive).

Trent Sharpe (ACC): Yes, this is an excellent point, mentions that squad sizes were slightly increased by a couple of students for one day carnival soccer pools last year. Squads in the soccer and netball will be increased again for these One Day Carnivals to help cater for this.

ACC Year 7-9 Lightning Carnivals/Year 7 Super Series – contingency update

Year 7-9 Winter Lightning Carnivals were postponed in Term 2 (4 & 6 May). These carnivals have been moved into Term 4; 19-21 October. All venue bookings have now been confirmed. These carnivals will be participation events with high team numbers expected. Normal ACC Lightning Carnival sports such as AFL, Soccer, Frisbee, Touch, Netball, and Rugby will all be played. The addition of basketball (boys), tennis (mixed) and hockey (mixed) will also give students a wide range of opportunities.

The Y7-9 Lightning Carnivals are a great opportunity to involve many teams and schools often bring along their whole cohort of Year 7 or Year 8 students and then split them into a range of sporting teams for the day. The Lightning Carnivals are fun, non competitive and social sporting days.

Team nominations will open during Term 3.

ACC Hockey Challenge - update

The ACC recently met with Hockey WA to re-establish the ACC Hockey Challenge for 2021 into a new and exciting divisional carnival model including a Division 1, 2 and a Div. 3 (*Development Division*). These divisions will help create more evenly balanced hockey games with smaller pools of teams that can best utilise existing hockey turf facilities in WA. Perth Hockey Stadium at Curtin University are committed to hosting the Division 1 & 2 ACC Hockey Challenge, which is a great coup for the competition moving forward. The new model would also provide some cost savings in venue hire if we move away from UWA Sports Park.

The proposal was emailed to Sport Coordinators/hockey team coaches that would usually field teams within the Hockey Challenge and this received very positive feedback. The proposal was also recently emailed to all Sport Coordinators. Following the positive feedback the ACC would like to move ahead with planning and bookings for the restructure in 2021.

A quick online poll was conducted by the ACC through Microsoft Teams (Polly app): I give "in principle" support to the recommendation for the ACC Hockey Challenge to move to a Divisional Model for 2021.

24 voted yes. 0 voted no. For voting purposes 47 schools were eligible to vote. To pass a vote the majority of members present need to vote in favour. 25 is a majority vote, even taking into account the abstained votes or no votes. On this basis the ACC will move ahead with planning for the Divisonal Model Hockey Challenge in 2021.

Roh Weddikkara (Peter Carnley): question about the potential for any mixed hockey?

Trent Sharpe (ACC): with the new divisional model I would not foresee the Division 1 or 2 being mixed hockey at this stage. These would likely be separate girls and boys Div. 1 & 2 competitions. The Development Division 3 has more flexibility and this could look at the team nominations involved and consider mixed hockey options or also less playing numbers such as 7 v 7 hockey (similar to the Y7 Super Series – Summer 7's).

Kyle March (ACC): also mentions that in the boys hockey challenge we generally always allow a team to have a couple of girls playing within the team if this helps bring the team numbers up to 11 on the field.
