ARRIVAL AND EVENT TIMES

BUS DROP OFF | PARKING | ACCESS

- Buses are to enter the carpark via Alderbury Street, which continues between Matthews Netball Centre and Wembley Oval
- Buses must exit onto Selby Street, which in a ONE WAY exit, in a southerly direction
- Ramp access is available via the carpark (detailed on the enclosed map)

ARRIVAL

- Check in with ACC staff on your arrival
- Collect *wristbands for those students who DO NOT have photo permissions* from the ACC

MARQUEES

- Schools are encouraged to bring a small marquee and a ground mat for the day, to be set up per the location detailed on the enclosed map
- The western end of the verandah area CAN NOT be utilised due to a SEDA College WA class on site

WEATHER

- While we have been fortunate in the past with weather conditions, a reminder to ensure that students and staff have suitable, warm clothing for the day, including a waterproof jacket if available.
- Should the weather be deemed not safe for the event to go ahead, the ACC will advise all schools by 8am on the morning of the event. If there is forecast of showers and wind, the event will go ahead as scheduled.

FIRST AID

For any athlete taken to the First Aid Post they must be supervised by a staff member

VENUE FACILITIES

- A coffee van will be on site for the duration of the event
- Water fountains are on site and are marked accordingly on the enclosed map
- Public toilet facilities will be utilised by both staff and students and are located on the Wembley Park side of the facilities, with access via the central stairs (that divides the clubhouse and changerooms), or via the ramp, (around the front of the facilities)
- The accessible changeroom will be available for those that require such, and is located at the eastern end of the verandah (detailed on enclosed map)
- A REMINDER that the cricket centre wicket is **OUT OF BOUNDS** for all students and staff. This will be cornered off with witches cones on the day of the carnival.

PRE-FIXTURE ACTIVITIES

- The day will commence the day with a soccer skills session, delivered by Mercy College students, and Football Futures staff.
- Students are to line up behind their allocated group number sign, where they will be collected and taken to an area by Mercy College coaches

FIXTURES

- Round robin fixtures will commence after the pre-fixture activities
- Mercy College students will umpire / mentor all games
- Schools are to support scoring all games with provided scoresheets. At the conclusion of every game, results are to be signed off by each team, and provided to the umpires to return to the Carnival Manager
- Clipboards MUST remain on the allocated field
- There are two pools, competitive (Manchester United) and participation (Chelsea). Each pool will play fixtured games across the course of the carnival, with GRAND FINAL round being played after the lunch period.
- Fixtures will be displayed on the reverse of each field sign

EQUIPMENT

- **Football boots and shin guards are NOT to be worn on the day of the carnival**
- Mouthguards are optional, but definitely not a necessity
- All balls, cones and goals will be provided (and set up) by the ACC and supporting partners
- Schools are to bring playing bibs, which are to be worn should school sport uniforms clash
- All peer support students, are requested to wear a high visual vest, and if not available from your school, please collect one from the ACC

- All peer support students on ground, are to wear a high visual vest, and if not available from your school, please collect one from the ACC

CERTIFICATE OF PARTICIPATION & SHIELD WINNERS

- These will be provided to each school, during the end of day presentations. Please have a student in mind and ready to collect on behalf of your school.
- The grand final winner of the competitive pool (Manchester United) will receive a trophy and perpetual shield – both of which are proudly supported by Football Futures.

GAME RULES

- Pitch size approximately 40m L x 30m W which is marked with field cones. The participation pool field sizes will be adjusted, and may be slightly smaller
- Games will run for 15 minutes, with NO half time break
- There is a 10 minute change over time allocated between fixtured round games
- 7 players per team on the field at one time, which includes a **maximum** of 2 peer support students on the field at once
- Teams can make unlimited substitutions during games
- Goals are smaller than a standard soccer goal and there are NO GOALKEEPERS
- A goal area will be marked (with field cones) which NO player may enter
- General outdoor soccer rules apply, with the following modifications :
 - Side tackles are NOT allowed
 - No offsides
 - The ball may be 'rolled', 'kicked' or 'thrown overhead' from the sideline as a restart
- Goals may be scored only from the offensive half of the field. Goals scored from the defensive half of the court will be disallowed, and a free kick awarded on the halfway line
- For free kicks, goal kicks and restarts, defenders must be a minimum of 2 metres from the ball
- All players, apart from the goalkeeper, are required to play both defence and attack throughout all games
- A ball hitting a wheelchair is considered to be in that person's possession and is placed in the player's lap, to be pushed out and into play
- The maximum distance **any player** can travel with the ball is 10m

PEER SUPPORT STUDENTS

- Peer support students are to **play alongside students**, supporting their skills and game, and to **pass the ball, to facilitate maximum participation** from all. They are to **are to provide mentoring and on-field coaching** and **NOT lead the direction of play**.
- Peer support students must also be rotated in positions, to ensure that participants are provided the opportunity to play in numerous positions across the course of the carnival.
- Peer support students are **NOT to score**, and if they do, the result will not be recorded, with the opposition receiving a free kick out of goals.
- Peer support students on ground, must wear a high vis VEST at all times, either provided by their school or the ACC.

GAMES POINT SCORING

- WIN = 3 points
- DRAW = 2 points
- LOSS = 1 point

FINALS

- Overall game points determine the ladder and subsequent finals fixtures. Should not all teams within a pool have a BYE, final ladder placings are determined through goal differential.
- If a GRAND FINAL result is a drawer, the team with the highest goal differential after fixtured rounds, will determine the overall winner

NOTE : finals fixtures will be announced prior to the conclusion of lunch
