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Guidelines for Membership Application

1. **AIM**:

- To promote moral and ethical behaviour which is consistent with Christian ethos among the students attending member schools by encouraging mutual respect and acceptance in their sporting, social and recreational activities; and
- To provide a range of high standard and inclusive sporting and recreational opportunities and activities to students attending the Association's member schools.

2. The major activities conducted by the Association are:

- a. Lightning Carnivals
 - Winter Sports participation carnivals—Year 7/8/9
- b. Athletic Carnivals—Divisional A to J
- c. Swimming Carnivals—Divisional A to J
- d. Cross Country Carnival
- e. Inclusive Sport: carnivals for students with disabilities.
- f. Competitive One Day Carnivals
 - Hockey (Open age)
- AFL (Year 10 & Year 7)
 - Year 7 Super Series (AFL, Hockey, Netball, Soccer, Basketball)
- g. ACC Championship—all association elimination tournament
- Basketball, Soccer and Netball (Open age)
- h. Inter-School Sport Sub-Associations:
 - * COASTAL ASSOCIATED SCHOOLS (CAS).
 - * NORTH EASTERN ASSOCIATED SCHOOLS (NEAS)
 - * NORTH WESTERN ASSOCIATED SCHOOLS (NWAS)
 - * NORTHERN ASSOCIATED SCHOOLS (NAS)
 - * SOUTHERN ASSOCIATED SCHOOLS (SAS): Senior & Junior
 - * ROCKINGHAM KWINANA ASSOCIATED SCHOOLS (RKAS)

3. MEMBERSHIP

- a. Criteria
 - I. Independent or non-government secondary school status;
 - II. School registration with the Government of Western Australia; and
 - III. A commitment to support the aim, objects or purposes of the Association.
- b. Application for Membership: To be made in writing by the Principal on the "Application for Membership Form" to the President of the Association.
- c. Gender: Co-educational and single gender schools form the membership of the Association.
- d. Non-Member Invitation: Except by special invitation, member schools only may take place in activities organized by the Association.
- e. Representatives: Principals are the official representatives of member schools.
- f. Withdrawal from Membership: Twelve months notice of withdrawal from membership and/ or activities of the Association are required.
- g. Sub-Association: To pursue more effectively the aims of the Association, member schools with a regional or other common interest, may form a Sub-Association with the approval of Council
- h. Current Membership: 89 members consisting of 71 metropolitan and 18 country schools throughout the state of Western Australia with a total school population of 56,000 students.

4. MEMBERSHIP FEES

- a. Affiliation Fees:
 - (i) Metropolitan member schools pay an annual affiliation fee. The affiliation fee is paid per student enrolled in the school and is currently \$12.14 per student.
 - (j) Country schools do not pay any affiliation fees.

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b. Sport Levies:

Participation in any ACC activity incurs a cost (sports levy) to the school. Sport Levies vary depending on the level of participation, the activity and the number of students competing. Prospective member schools should contact the ACC for more information on current ACC sports levies. By way of example, a new school participating in the J Division Swimming Carnival in 2022 would pay a levy of \$672.00 for this activity. All ACC member schools pay sport levies, including country schools.

4. MANAGEMENT

- a. Staffing: The ACC currently employs 4.65 (FTE) employees to manage the association; a Director of Sport, Executive Officer, Sport Operations Manager, Inclusive and Participation Manager and Sport Operations Officer. The ACC office is located at the Newman Siena Centre 33 Williamstown Road Doubleview.
- b. Committees: The ACC has a four tiered committee structure:
 - 1. Council: The Council comprises the Principals of the member schools. Council determines policy and approves the association Charter on the basis of recommendations made by the Executive.
 - 2. Executive: The Executive comprises members of Council elected by Council and oversees the administration and implementation of policy throughout the association.
 - 3. Sports Management Committee: The SMC comprises the Sports Coordinators of the member schools. The SMC implements Council policy and the specific administrative tasks associated with the ACC Charter.
 - 4. Sub Associations: Sub Association groups meet to implement the specific requirements of their sub-association activities.

c. The Charter:

The Charter is a comprehensive document divided into functional sections to communicate the constitution, history, management processes and relevant information of major events. The Charter is the 'core' of all ACC sports management processes.

Member schools are invited to use the Charter for their own in-school purposes. The charter is 'copyright' and must remain within schools when staff leave.

The Charter is available as a series of "on-line" documents in PDF format. These documents are stored on a private web site page where schools can download updated copies. Hard/printed copies are no longer issued to schools.

d. Communication:

The ACC is committed to utilizing the latest technology to improve communication between itself and the member schools. To achieve this the ACC has a comprehensive web site (www.accsport.asn.au), which is used as the primary communication tool and storage site for ACC information. The ACC also utilizes email for the majority of its correspondence.
